CFAC addresses these factors through programs and policies that connect farmlands, farmers, and markets to strengthen western Montana's food landscape and build a thriving and equitable food system in our region. Our goal is to increase the consumption of locally produced, sustainable food in western Montana to 30% by 2030.





OUR WORK IN 2016

Farmlands

- Mobilized over 200 people in support of protection in Missoula County
- Collaborated with realtors, land trusts, landowners, and conservation organizations to recommend farmland conservation policies to Missoula County Commissioners

Farmers

- Implemented robust business and production training programs, attended by over 500 beginning farmers
- Launched the Farm Link Montana website to better help new farmers find land, employment, mentors and resources -- with over 38,000 page views by more than 6,000 users
- Partnered with statewide and national entities to provide new financing options for beginning farmers

Markets

- Expanded Double SNAP Dollars throughout our region, nearly doubling participation and helping over 1,000 families increase their buying power for local food
- Increased local food sales by 29% among Double SNAP Dollars retailers
- Grew the local economy by coordinating over \$100,000 spent through Double SNAP Dollars

LOOKING FORWARD
